#### REGISTRATION OF ORCHID HYBRIDS

We have received the following information from Sanders, St. Albans, England, which will be of interest to some of our members:

"In 1895, Messrs. Sander & Sons, Orchid Growers... instituted a system for the registration of orchid hybrids and in due course published the first issue of Sander's List of Orchid Hybrids... Recently, the family business has been reorganized and the great increase in the number of orchid hybridists has led to such an increase in the work of registration that as of January 1, 1961, the Royal Horticultural Society will take over the registration of orchid hybrids and in due course, publish particulars of all registrations made after December 31, 1960, under the title "Sander's List of Orchid Hybrids". Anyone wishing to register a hybrid after January 1, 1961, should

do it with the Registrar of Orchid Hybrids, The Royal Horticultural Society, Vincent Square, London, S.W. 1, using a form which may be obtained from the Registrar". Fee for each name is approximately \$3.00 U.S.A., but if you must be British, it's L 1.1s.Od.


