For some time, we have wished that time would permit "Doc" Charles to speek longer on the subject of "Botanicals" when we have had our Plant Forums. At the next meeting, we shall have the opportunity of hearing him as the entire program will be on that fascinating subject . These exotic and varying genera open a new field to many orchid growers who have been concerned primarily with cattleyas and cymbidiums. This program is especially recommended for those who have not yet become familiar with Botanicals, as well as those who have loved them for a long time.

At the last meeting, Mr. Ernest Hetherington of F.A. Stewart's, Inc., was our speaker. He gave us another of his informative talks on Cymbidiums, their history, growth habits, and included many suggestions for their successful culture. They must be given the basic conditions to which they have become accustomed over the years: lots of light, except when in bloom, more food and water than any other species, repotting only when they have completely outgrown the pot and a temperature differential of about 25 degrees. Mercury can go down to freezing when plants are not in blcom, and as high as 95 to 100 degrees. Mr. Hetherington illustrated his remarks with a chalk talk and also slides.

Mr. Harry Rabella, Forum Chairman, introduced "Doc" Charles to comment on the Botanicals, and Mr. Hetherington and Mr. Paul Gripp on the Cattleyas and Cymbidiums.

#### PLANT PROCUREMENT






