The plants for the July meeting will be brought by Mr. C. R. Hulen so we can expect some very outstanding things.

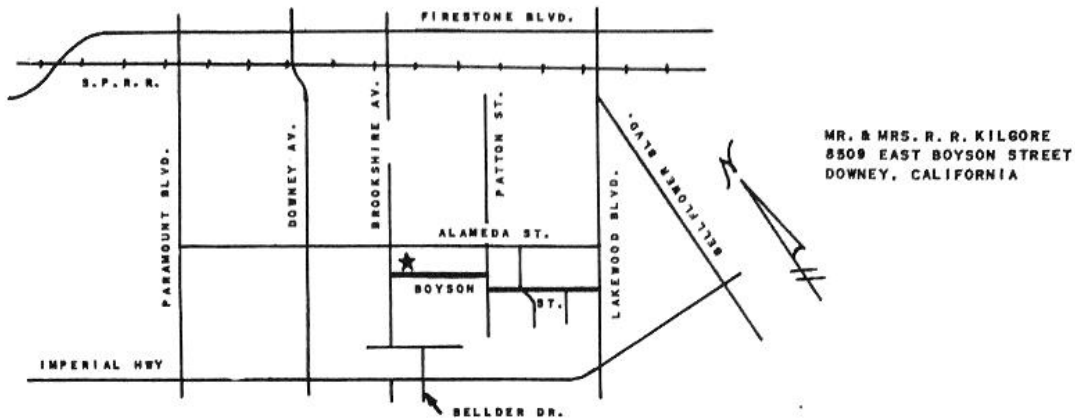
PLANT FORUM

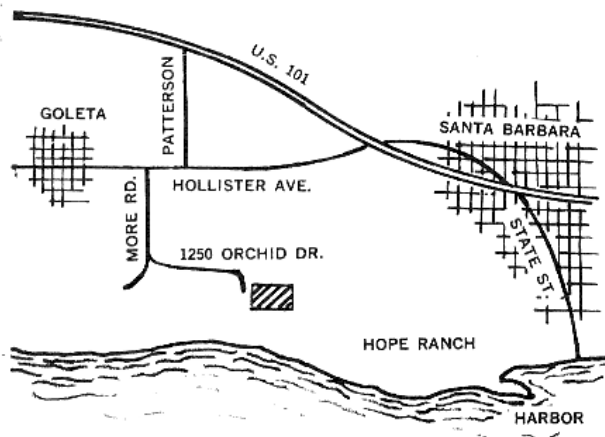
