HAVE YOU HEARD? Photos of your favorite flower or plant can be taken and enjoyed if a few simple rules are followed:

- 1. Be sure to have the image sharp and clear. ...
- A small lens opening will give more "depth of field" or the greatest area of sharp focus.
- Use a cloth or cardboard background to hide that which would be out of focus.
- 4. A background of contrasting color about 2 or 3 feet square should be used.
- 5. For black and white photography use one of three backgrounds -- white, medium gray, and black.
- 6. In color a blue-gray background is excellent.
- 7. A dull finish is good on cloth and cardboard backgrounds.
- Store cloth backgrounds on cardboard tubes. Creases show up in photographs.

DO YOU DO YOUR OWN SPRAYING? Be sure you wear a mask.
"If you find spraying necessary, be sure to cleanse the sprayer thoroughly after each use. Partially fill the container, using 4 tablespoons of baking soda to every pint of water. Shake thoroughly and spray some through the nozzle. Then clean the outside. Discard the washings some place where they can do no harm --not in the sewage system." April 1966 Horticulture

QUESTION & ANSWERS: Q. Can salts and green scum be removed from clay pots?

A. One way is to use a copper sulfate solution - 1/8 to 1/4 pound of granulated copper sulfate to a 10 quart pail of water. Scrub with a wire brush.

Q. How can slugs and snails be controlled? A. A methaldehyde bait can be used. Be sure to keep it out of reach of children and pets. Store in a high - safe place.

DID YOU KNOW? Orchids come in every color except black.
Once or twice a month is often enough to feed a mature orchid plant.

You can grow orchids in the house and/or bring the blooming plant into the house to enjoy the flowers on the plant. A table, stand or shelf near a window - preferably an East window - will do. Moist pebbles in a tray under the plants will provide humidity, but never let the water among the pebbles reach pot level. Orchids don't like "wet feet."

Phalaenopsis - their worst natural enemies are snails and slugs.

The phalenopsis does not have pseudo-bulbs for food and moisture storage. Therefore it requires more frequent watering and responds more rapidly to feedings.

Practically all its feeding roots are on top or outside of the pot or basket.

The few roots that go inside of the pot merely help hold it there until it can get anchored to its container.

Do you want to clean the leaves of your plant? One way is to use a soft sponge and sweet milk, wiping each leaf promptly with a dry cloth.
