FAMOUS CYMBIDIUMS, PAST AND PRESENT: by Paul F. Gripp cont.

Alexanderi 'Westonbirt', F.C.C./RHS (insigne 'Westonbirt' x Eburneo-Lowianum 'Concolor', F.C.C./RHS): -- Alexanderi 'Westonbirt' is, with out a doubt, the most famous of all Cymbidiums. The first cross of Alexanderi was made by Mr. Alexander in 1911, but he made a second cross in 1916 using Eburneo-Lowianum 'Concolor' with insigne and this was the cross that gave Alexanderi 'Westonbirt'. When it first bloomed in 1922 it was considered the finest Cymbidium to date, and then, as a parent, it eventually proved to be a tetraploid, producing many of the world's greatest flowers and huge populations of very good quality blooms. Through it also come the chance tetraploid Rosanna 'Pinkie' and, in combination with other tetraploids great populations of new tetraploids such as Balkis. Although there were other fine varieties of Alexanderi, Alexanderi 'Westonbirt' is considered to be the best in quality and certainly, because of its generic uniqueness, it far outdistances all others. by Kurt Greer Orchids can be grown
outdoors in many parts of So. Calif.,
along the coast from Malibu south, a few
miles inland in areas with an elevation
of a few hundred feet, and along the south
slopes of the Santa Monica mountains. A
few miles of this section from Beverly
Hills east, the so-called "Thermo Belt' is
considered the driest and healthiest section
of Los Angeles. It is free of smog, fog and
frost.

We are most fortunate to live in this area at an elevation of 600 feet approximately eight miles from the Pacific Ocean, and around 30 feet above street level. The sea breeze makes summer and winter temperatures more agreeable, strong winds never reaching us. A steep bank on the north and east sides protects us from cold air. When we built our house in 1952 this bank of partially decomposed granite 20-40 feet high and 100 feet long was a great liability. As protection against erosion we built an 18 inch high wall in front and planted between the bank and this wall climbing fig (ficus repens). After a very slow start the bank was covered within a few years and we had the best protection possible, thousands of roots had grown deep into the granite.
