Guest Speaker: Daniel L. Geiger, PhD
Subject: Growing Orchids in a Terrarium
Monday, January 23, 2012

Daniel L. Geiger, PhD is a marine invertebrate systematist working on biodiversity and evolution of basal marine snails at the Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History. His interests in plants come from natural history photography and gardening. He is a member of the Orchid Society of Santa Barbara, SCOSS, and the California Native Plant Society, and grows native California orchids outdoors. More recently he added an indoor terrarium with tropical orchids. Growing orchids in a terrarium is similar to growing in a miniature greenhouse with artificial lights. Daniel will provide an overview of all aspects of planning, installation, and running a plant terrarium, with special emphasis on automatic control of environmental parameters (light, temperature, and moisture). The second half of his talk focuses on orchid species and their performance, with many pictures of a variety of morphologies.

New Year's Resolutions

The start of another year always gives me fresh resolve to "do it right." So, with that in mind, I resolve to pot or mount my *Laelia anceps* early in the year (some are already putting out new roots). I will repot cymbidiums at the start of spring, and repot *Laelia purpurata* nearer midyear. I resolve to throw out those pathetic, but treasured old plants with which I have so much history, the ones with barely a leaf left to provide nutrition, and those that have not flowered in the last five years. I promise to repot the plants at the back of the bench, the ones in which I may have lost interest, only to discover they were last potted in 2005! I promise to keep my plants properly shaded, to not throw them in some dark corner, or leave them out in the baking sunlight on a day we have Santa Ana winds. I will be resolute in my determination to keep my orchids watered, not too much and not too little; more for the small and recently planted pots, and less for plants in larger pots with older mixes. I swear I will remember that many, if not most, orchids respond slowly to changes in culture, and so avoid frantically changing from one culture strategy to the next. When flowers need staking, I will stake them. When scale, aphids, and mealy bugs attack, I will respond with an appropriate counterattack, either chemical sprays, hand treatment with alcohol and a cotton swab, or natural predators and repellants. Finally, I resolve to put aside some time to just enjoy my orchids, to wander among them and contemplate their wonderful flowers and odd growing habits, and to share the joy of these exotic plants with others.
