THE ORCHID DIGEST

There is a change in view in the Orchid Digest Magazine. Heretofore, we have had six issues a year, every other month, but beginning the first of 1960, the magazine will appear TEN times a year, once a month with the exception of the summer months, when two issues only will arrive. JUDGING


