The speaker for the March meeting will be Mr. Paul Gripp from the Santa Barbara Orchid Estate. Each one of us can learn something more about these fascinating flowers, and no one can give us more information than Mr. Gripp. He has a trememdous background in the field of orchids; starting to work for Mr. Chrisman while attending UCLA. He graduated with highest honors in Ornamental Horticulture and has been full time grower for Mr. Chrisman most of the time since. His great interest in orchids will make this program an outstanding event.

Last month's speaker, Mr. Frank Fordyce, of Fred A. Stewart, Inc., took for his subject "It Takes All Kinds", being about the people who grow orchids, rather than about the orchids themselves. These fall into definite groups - "The Solid Citizen", "The Scientist", "The Ladies", "The Artist" and "The Semi-Professional". It's been fun speculating into which category Mr. Fordyce has placed each one of us. 
MEMBERSHIP DRIVE
