The speaker for the May meeting is one of the outstanding orchid growers in this area, Mr. Hugo Freed. It is difficult to add anything more to the information most of us have on this eminent gentleman, sort of like carrying coals to Newcastle, as Mr. Freed's name has been synonymous with orchids, especially with Phaleanopsis, for as long as we can remember. We can only say, Welcome to South Coast, Mr. Freed.

Last month Mr. Paul Brecht gave a most informative talk on orchids in general, especially their history. Orchids comprise the largest family of flowering plants in the world - one out of seven plants grown on earth today are orchids, there being over 20,000 species. They were first introduced into England in 1731, but early attempts to grow them were disappointing. Today, 60% of all orchids cultivated are Cattleyas. Mr. Brecht's advice to all growers, especially to beginners, is to study the habitat of the natural plant and, as far as possible, duplicate that condition. He then showed some beautiful slides of prize plants.

#### PLANT FORUM

Mr. Harry Rapella, the genial Chairman of the Plant Forum, asked Mrs. Crothers and "Doc" Charles to make the commentary on the botanicals. There were many lovely ones on the tables brought by the Crothers, Mr. Bailey, "Doc" Charles and others. Mr. Phillip Ilsley discussed the cymbidiums and needed a fork-lift to raise some of the huge pots. Mr. Paul Brecht commented on the Cattleyas. This time of year there were more botanicals and cymbidiums than Cattleyas, however.

## PLANT DRAWING

The plants for the drawing this month came from Ilsley's Orchids and were largely choice seedlings. Our thanks again to the Old Faithfuls, who donate every month, Harry Rapella, Southern California Greenhouse Co. and Rheinfrank & Hudson.
