To those of you who were fortunate enough in March 1959 to have heard Mr. Miller's fascinating talk on "Orchids of the Phillipines," we offer another treat at the June meeting, when Mr. Miller will again call upon his wide experience in the field of orchid collecting. His subject this time is world wide as he has travelled all over, collecting orchids as well as a wealth of knowledge concerning them. Mr. Miller resided in the Philippines for 16 years and was Secretary of the Orchid Society there. He is now connected with the Veterans Administration Stateside. Incidentally, his talk will be illustrated by colored slides taken around the world. Altogether, this is a program none of us will want to miss, and it would be a good one to bring a friend to who has been bitten by that little bug, "Orchidae."

Last month our speaker was Mr. Hugo Freed, General Manager of Arthur Freed Orchids, Inc., of Santa Monica and Zuma Beach. Born in New York, Mr. Freed early came to California, and has been growing orchids for the past 12 years. He read an ad in the "Los Angeles Times" about a cymbidium auction and made the mistake of telling his brother about it - that was all it took to get them started; they are now commercial growers on a wide scale, with their first love Phaleanopsis. Mr. Freed then gave the interesting story of the discovery of these beautiful flowers about 1750 in the hottest and most moist sections of Burma. They were first introduced into England in 1806. At first the flowers were small and of poor shape and substance; there are 40 known species and several natural hybrids. Mr. Freed's slides showing the modern hybrids which he and his brother have developed were lovely. Many thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Freed for a wonderful evening.


