Ants and other pests seem to like the newly forming buds so a good spray is a must. Also Chlordane dust sprinkled around the bulbs will discourage the ants. Use bamboo stakes to hold up the spikes so that there will be no mechanical injury to buds and try to keep specks of dust and dirt from adhering to the tender buds—a single speck of dirt will develop into an unsightly blotch on the flower when it opens.

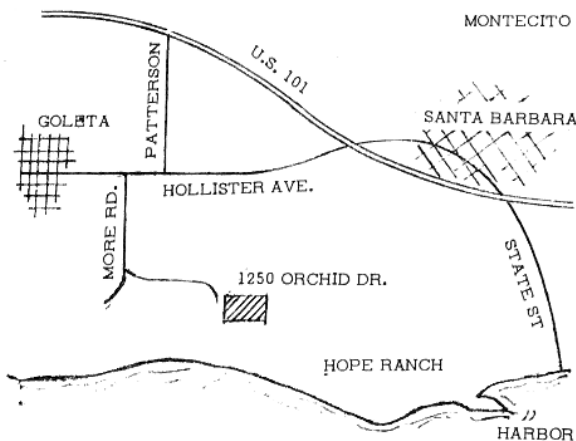
