The speaker for this meeting will be the genial Eugene Casey from San Diego. Gene is president of the Orchid Digest Corporation, a judge for the American Orchid Society, Orchid Digest Corp. and the Cymbidium Society of America, Inc. His program promises to be a treat as he has picked out a picture of an award plant and also plants which have not quite qualified for an award. He will give a complete history of them right from the start, and will show why this plant won while others were not quite good enough. Of course, we have no soreheads in this Society, but it is hoped that such a program as Mr. Casey will present will make it clear to all of us the sometimes small percentage of difference between awards and non-awards. Mr. Casey's well known knowledge and experience in this field makes him an authority on the subject of judging of plants, and it is always a pleasure and a priviledge when he makes the trip up from San Diego to be with us.

Frank Morishita of the Department of Entomology, University of California at Redlands, gave a most interesting program last month. He first showed slides which gave very graphic illustrations of damage to orchid plants and flowers, both mechanical -such as sand or water damage -- and pest damage, along with pictures of the various pests. After showing the slides, Mr. Morishita made suggestions for the control of each. He told of two new products that will probably be on the market the first of the yearwhich have been tested and are expected to be of great help in controlling many pests. They are ZECTRAN, made by Dow Chemical Co., which Mr. Morishita said should be useful in controlling everything from scale to slugs, and DIAZINON, made by American Cyanamid, which is a systemic poison and can be used for thrips aphids. mites. etc.

for thrips, aphids, mites, etc.
Mr. Morishita said he could not stress too strongly the necessity
for extreme care and caution in using any of the powerful insecticides that are being used for pest control. They are poisons,
and should be treated as such. He recommends gloves and a mask
whenever they are used.

We do gratefully acknowledge this gift and regret our oversight in not mentioning it last month.



Intermedia 'Coerulea' has very light blue sepals and petals with a darker blue lip. Should result in some very good blue color in this progeny. Limited number of reflasks available as follows: 250 cc Flask -- (Approx. 15 to 20 plants). \$15.00 1000 cc Flask - (Approx. 75 to 100 plants). \$75.00 We will ship out of flasks in polyethelene bags when plants are ready to transplant. Seedlings should be ready in 11/2" bare root size in the spring of 1962.




