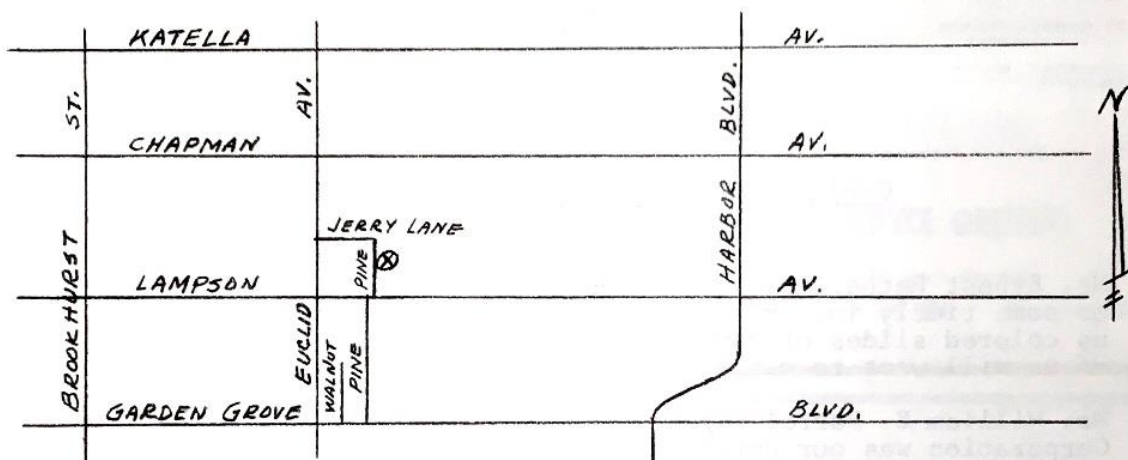
### LIBRARY
