CINNAMON SCENTED ORCHID: Jack Kramer A more reliable house plant than the cinnamon orchid is hard to find. The cinnamon-scented flowers, a pale yellow when they first open, turn a vivid butter-yellow with each petal tip gracefully turned outwards and the lip stained with red and orange dots. A healthy plant gives a succession of single flowers for a month or more. And even out of bloom this orchid is decorative for many months with its long fresh-green leaves. Only 12 to 14 inches tall, Lycaste aromatica fits perfectly on the window sill.
