RIBBON JUDGING RULES:

- A. The maximum number of ribbons will be four(4); any combination, no matter if all are first or all cultural or any combination. But only 4 ribbons and a maximum of nine(9) points can be given in any evening.
- B. 1-2-3 place ribbons and cultural placement.
- C. 3-2-1 points assigned to each ribbon placement. 3 points assigned to cultural ribbon.
- D. Ribbon chairman will keep track of the total points.
- E. 3 members of the Society in good standing and not currently involved in the judging room are to award ribbons to what they like best.- No rules or regulations to follow.
- F. Judges 'decision' is final.
- G. If the plant is on the general plant table it can be judged.
- H. A trophy will be given for the highest number of points at the annual banquet.
- I. A trophy will be given for the rest of the 1967 year.
- J. To be eligible to receive a trophy you have to be a member in good standing of South Coast. (paid up.)
