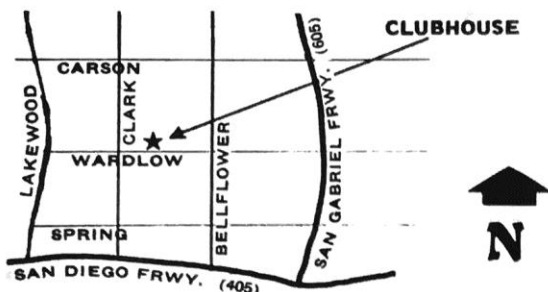

Follow This Freeway Map to Wardlow Park In Long Beach

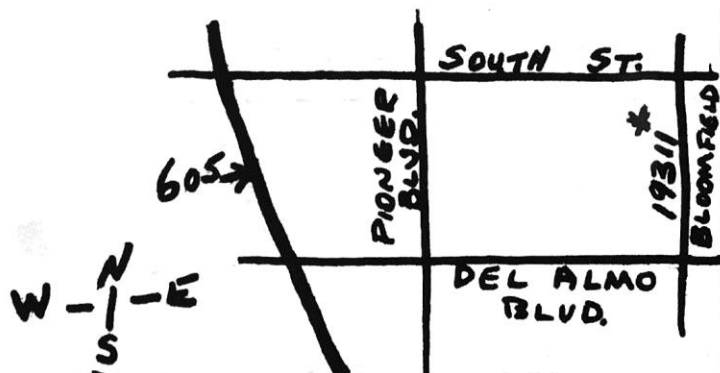
NOVICE CLASS

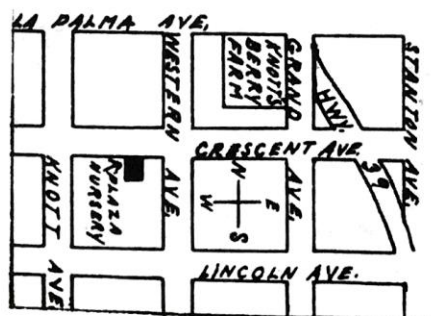
