JANUARY BANQUET: If you weren't present at our 29th annual banquet, you missed a very special event! As you know, Charlie Bowman the perpetual "man behind the sceen," past president, and beloved member of S.C.O.S. - was our guest of honor, and believe me, it was more than an honor to be able to recognize such a fine person and orchidophile.

Poor Charlie - in all the years I've known him, I've never seen him without a smile until that night. He looked so worried, so pensive - perhaps it was because he knew his good friend Paul Brecht was Master of Ceremonies, and Charlie remembered what he did to <u>him</u> last year.....

But at last, dinner was over, Paul took the podium, and announced, "THIS IS YOUR LIFE, CHARLIE BOWMAN." It went something like this:

Charlie was born on March 6, many moons ago in Monrovia, Ca. We saw the baby pictures to prove it, too! He attended school there, and while at Monrovia High, went out for football, baseball, and track. Would you believe he had a head full of <u>HAIR</u> then? He won many honors in track and field events - you remember good ol' hot foot - but his teammates called him "Bonie" for his outstanding knees. He also did something else in high school he met Ester. They were married in June, 1924. And we saw the marriage liscense to prove it!

Greenhouses weren't always Charlie's business - he worked as a railroad surveyor, went to USC and studied engineering, bought an ice company, worked as sales manager for a distributing company, was a civil engineer in the shipyards, and was again sales manager for a refrigerator company. Somewhere in all that, he had time for his two sons, Albert and Norman. Then that fateful day occured in 1941, when he took a position at Southern California Greenhouse as "Technical, Field, and Sales Engineer." The rest is history.

Many of Charlie's friends, as well as family, were present to honor him. Ernie Heatherington of Stewart's had this to say of Charlie's career: "You have told everyone how to adjust your greenhouses, but you've never told anyone a d----d thing how to grow orchids!" Then Fordyce "Red" Marsh presented Charlie with a certificate of appretiation on behalf of Orchid Digest Corp. Next, we were reminded of Charlie's tireless service to SCOS. He was President in 1958-9, and again in 1969, when he originated our annual Luau. Charles Stockham told us that the reason Charlie has always been Show Committee Chairman is that he "...shines at shoveling compost at shows..." He was then presented with a trophy for his "untiring work." Art McCann also presented Charlie with a Certificate of Appreiation for his work on all our shows. Other certificates
