Speaker Helmut Rohrl
"COOL GROWING ONCIDINAE AND THEIR HYBRIDS"

Mr. Helmut Rohrl will speak on Odontoglossums and their hybrids. He will cover Odontoglossum, Odontiodas and their intergeneric hybrids and include images of the wide range in color, patterns and shapes. There will also be a brief discussion of growing conditions and time for your questions.

His orchid experience dates back to his childhood, when he would look for native orchids in the mountains during weekend hikes with his family. Orchids A to Z

Bulbophyllum

SUBFAMILY Epidendroideae, TRIBE Dendrobieae, SUBTRIBE Bulbophyllinae. The largest genus of orchids with over 1200 species distributed among several subgenera and sections. Most species occur in the rain forests or cloud forests of southeast Asia, particularly New Guinea which is believed to be the center of distribution. In general, plants are sympodial with one or two leaved pseudobulbs spaced closely or at some distance along the rhizome. The fleshy leaves may be more than a meter long or only a few millimeters depending on the species. Inflorescences arise laterally from the rhizome or the base of the pseudobulb rather than from its apex. The species flowers range from several centimeters to a millimeter in diameter, though most flowers are quite small. In fact, entire plants of some Bulbophyllum species such as B. pygmaeum and B. minutissimum are among the smallest in the orchid family. Most often the poilinators are flies, attracted by floral fragrances (which may be like urine, sap, blood, dung or rotting meat) and/or by floral parts moving in the breeze. The floral odor of Bulbophyllum beccarii, has been likened to a herd of dead elephants. Because of the creeping rhizome and sometimes widely spaced pseudobulbs, bulbophyllums are better suited to slabs of wood, cork or tree-fern than to pots. Allow high humidity but also ample air movement to prevent bacteria and fungi from infecting the leaves.
