



A LITTLE ORCHID BACKGROUND.....

For thousands of years in every continent man has had direct contact with orchids. In Europe, where cultivation dates back to the ancient civilizations of the Mediterranean, the fathers of orchidology are considered to be the Greek philosopher Theophrastus (372? - 287 B.C.) amd, much later, the Swedish botanist Carl Linnaeus (1707 –78).

It was Theophrastus who first used the Greek word orchis to indicate the particular group of plants whose roots, dried and chopped, were used in the traditional pharmacopoeia of Greece and neighboring Asia Minor as antidepressants and stimulants, and even today in some rural areas of these countries "salep," a nutritious drink prepared from the dried tubers of certain orchids, is not uncommonly found. It was not until the mid eighteenth century that the name was applied to the whole family of orchids in Linnaeus' Species Plantarum, which marked the beginning of modern plant taxonomy.

However, besides Theophrastus and Linnaeus, many other people were interested in orchids principally as medicinal plants, and this is testified by references in the medical books and herbals of men such as Dioscorides (first century A.D.), Otto Brunfels of Strasburg (c.1488-1534), Leonard Fuchs (1501-66) and John Gerad (1542-1612).

In China some 2,500 years ago, Confucious commended orchids for their beauty and scent and the first book on the cultivation or orchids, giving descriptions of species and varieties, was probably written in Chinese in around the year A.D. 1000.

ORCHIDS A TO Z

"C" CATTLEYA

TRIBE Epidendreae SUBTRIBE Laeliinae

Cattleya is a genus of 48 species distributed throughout mainland tropical America. The genus is characterized by the presence of cylindrical pseudobulbs of several nodes with apical, thick leaves; a racemose inflorescence with a sheath at the base, the usually large and showy flowers; and the four hard clavate pollinia.

These are epiphytic plants usually of wet forests at elevations from sea level to 1,500 meters. The majority of the species are found in the tops of tall trees in moist to wet forest.

Most of the species can be cultivated in the intermediate house with abundant water provided during the growing season and less water while resting.

This genus, and the man-made hybrids with species of *Laelia*, *Rhyncholaelia*, *Sophronitis* and some lesser genera, have provided the majority of orchid enthusiasts with the prime source of their interest, challenges, victories, and pride in orchid growing. The spectacular flowers of most of the species and the hybrids produced from them have dominated the florist market for the last century as the premier flower. Endless hours of gratification, frustration and envy have resulted from the cultivation of these orchids. Outrageous prices have been paid for particularly choice, awarded clones.
