My Ten Favorite Cattleya Species presented by Douglas Overstreet Monday, May 22, 2023

Douglas Overstreet has grown orchids continually since he was 10 years old. He comes by his interest in plants and animals naturally. His family have been American farmers since 1684! The first orchid he purchased in 1972 was Cattleya Trimos, a primary hybrid between C. trianaei and C. mossiae. The first orchid he flowered was a phalaenopsis hybrid.

Doug moved to California in 1975 and continued his love affair with orchids. In 1984, his collection began to grow by leaps and bounds with his first professional job. He also became a very active participant in the local orchid community. He began to work with orchids professionally in 2000 as a private consultant. Gradually, this became his full-time occupation. He has managed private collections for leading hobbyists in Southern California for the last 16 years. He is an Accredited AOS Judge in the Pacific South Region. An accomplished writer and educator, Doug has written articles for many different publications including *Orchid Digest* and has served on the Editorial Committee of that publication as Assistant Editor. He has spoken to orchid societies nationwide. Prior to joining the Huntington full time as a horticulturist, he was a frequent guest lecturer for the Huntington. Currently, he is the orchid specialist in charge of the Thornton Conservatory and the Ernest Hetherington Memorial Cattleya Collection. (See photo next page.)

Cattleyas have been the focus of many orchid collections since efforts to find and import them started in the early 1800s. Doug will focus on this popular genus by talking about his personal choice of 10 favorite Cattleyas and their culture.

Dr. Norito Hasegawa (1940-2023)

Dr. Norito Hasegawa, well known for his work on the genus Paphiopedilum, SCOS member, AOS Judge, and a joy to know, passed away recently. He was a frequent speaker at SCOS meetings; here is his biography, from his two-part presentation (Jan. and Feb. 2014) to the SCOS.

"Norito Hasegawa is a retired dentist, an overextended hobbyist (considered commercial for tax purposes), and a 3 million miler due to travelling to many foreign countries, talking and/or judging in places such as Japan, South Africa, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Denmark, Germany, New Zealand, Taiwan, England, France, Switzerland and many cities in the USA.

He is primarily a hybridizer of Slipper Orchids (Paphiopedilum) although his interests and collection of 15,000 orchids include miniature cattleyas, phalaenopsis, cymbidiums and variegated orchids of all sorts. He first became interested in orchids after seeing orchids en mass at the World Orchid Conference held in Long Beach in 1966. After he bought his first orchids, he failed miserably, but persisted in trying to grow them outdoors, and in no time he had hundreds. Now, he can't imagine his life without orchids. Orchids are an endeavor of science, taxonomy, hybridizing, art, sociability, quiet reflections, and mad parties—join the addiction and fun.

He is married to Joyce, with three children Lisa, Todd and Mark with paphiopedilums named after each of them. He is owner of Paphanatics, unLimited; a judge in both the American Orchid Society and the Cymbidium Society of America for over 35 years. Norito will give us his special insight into growing Paphiopedilum orchids, tailored for the novice grower of this intriguing genus."
